Fast Facts About Freetown

Settled 1659

The Freemen's Purchase, April 2, 1659, was a 4mile tract of land purchased from the Wampanoag Indians.

Town Name - "Freetown"

Colonists who were "free men" purchased the land (Freemen's Purchase) and divided it into 26 lots which became known as "Freetown"

Pocasset Purchase

The Sogkonate Tribe claimed a section of the Freemen's Purchase was their land. After a court hearing, the property was purchased and divided into 30 lots and became known as New Freetown or East Freetown.

Incorporated 1683 Freetown celebrated its 325th Anniversary in 2008.

Town Hall-3 North Main St.

Was built in 1888 and was originally the home to all the town offices, police dept., fire department, and library.

Town Seal

State authorities recommended the use of town seals in 1890. When devising the seal for Freetown, the Chairman of the Board of Selectmen, Col. Silas P. Richmond took into consideration the "one little kettle" named in the Freemen's Purchase. The official seal was accepted by the town and was first used in 1893. The Town Clerk is designated as the "Keeper of the Seal."

Population

The population in Freetown is 9,206 per the 2020 Federal census.

Board & Committee Meetings – The Open Meeting Law



In accordance with the Open Meeting Law, the public is welcomed to attend all board meetings, whether held in person, virtually, or as a hybrid meeting. Meeting notices are legally posted are available to view 24-hours a day, 7 days a week, on the Town's website at <u>www.freetownma.gov</u> under each department or board. Physical meeting notices can also be found on the Town Hall bulletin board, 3 North Main Street in Assonet, as a secondary posting location.

All boards and committees must also produce meeting minutes in a timely manner (typically within 3 meetings or 30 days, whichever is later) following each meeting, that accurately set forth the date, time, place of the meeting and a list of the members present or absent, along with an accurate summary of the discussion of each subject and a record of all votes and decisions made. These meeting minutes can also be found on the Town's website at <u>www.freetownma.gov</u> under each department or board.

Public Health Nurse Lori Desmarais, RN, BSN

Freetown's Public Health Nurse has free clinic hours monthly at the Council on Aging (227 Chace Road, East Freetown), from 10am to 11am on the 2^{nd} Tuesday of each month.

Nursing Services Include: Blood Pressure Monitoring, Blood Sugar Monitoring, Wound Assessment, Vitamin B12 injections (prescribed), Referrals, Adult Immunizations, Health Education and Promotion & Home Visitation.

Voter Registration

The Board of Registrars and the Town Clerk maintain the voter list for Freetown, which is continuously updated. To register to vote in Massachusetts, you must be a U.S. Citizen, a resident of Massachusetts <u>and</u> be at least 18 years old on or before the next election. Important: you must register to vote in the community in which you <u>live</u> in – meaning, you must re-register to vote here in Freetown if you recently moved to Freetown (your voter registration does not automatically follow you).

To register to vote, simply visit <u>www.VoteInMA.com</u> to register online or to download a mail-in form that you can mail to the Office of the Town Clerk (P.O. Box 438, Assonet, MA 02702). You can also visit the office during regular business hours (Monday-Thursday, 8am-4pm and Friday, 8am-12noon) to register in person.

Registration Deadlines: Citizens wishing to vote in a particular election or Town Meeting must be registered to vote by 5pm ten (10) days ahead of the election or Town Meeting. Check <u>freetownma.gov/elections</u> for specific deadlines!

Annual Census/Street Listing

Local Census forms are mailed to every household in January of each year. The census form contains the information of all members in the household, including address, name, date of birth, occupation, voter status & party enrollment, veteran status, and nationality (if not US Citizen), plus the number of dogs. The form should be signed by the resident (under the penalties of perjury), dated and returned to the Office of the Town Clerk in the envelope provided as soon as possible. Forms can be returned via US mail or dropped off at the drop-boxes located at the Town Hall, Police Station or either of the libraries.

Children should also be listed on the census form. This information pertaining to child under the age of 17 is not considered a record for public access (information is accessible to the school committee and police department per MGL). The veteran's status can only be released to the local veterans' service officer, adjutant general and secretary of veterans' services.

The census envelope contains a warning (as directed by Massachusetts General Law) stating that failure to respond to a census mailing for 2 consecutive years will result in the removal from the active voting list. By answering the census you help your community to obtain state and federal funds and also provide valuable demographic information.

A blank census form can be downloaded at <u>www.freetownma.gov/census</u>, and it can be completed and submit to Office of the Town Clerk if you did not receive one in the mail. This form can also be used by new residents who move to town during the course of the year.

Note that the Annual Census is different than the Federal decennial census administered by the Federal Government every 10 years, next scheduled for 2030. Those years, you will receive both the Local Annual Census and the Federal Census.

Dog Licenses

All dogs 6 months and older need to be licensed in accordance with Mass. General Law and local Freetown By-Laws. The annual license is required by March 31st each year. Rabies vaccinations have to be current in order to obtain a license.

Single licenses may be purchased through the mail by sending the license fee along with a copy of the rabies certificate and a self-addressed stamped envelope to the Office of the Town Clerk. The current fee for a neutered male or a spayed female is \$10.00 and \$15.00 for a dog that is not altered. Residents over the age of 70 qualify for one (1) free dog license per household.

Residents that have an up-to-date (not expired) rabies certificate on file with the Office of the Town Clerk can renew their existing license online at <u>www.freetownma.gov/dogs</u>.

You can e-mail copies of rabies certificates to the Office of the Town Clerk at any time: dogs@freetownma.gov.

Kennel Licenses: If you have five (5) or more dogs on premises (whether for private or for commercial purposes), a Kennel license is required. Kennels vary in price according to the size of the kennel. To apply for a kennel license, please contact Lisa Podielsky, Animal Control Officer, at 508-386-8227.

Please note that commercial kennels need prior kennels need prior authorization from Zoning Enforcement Officer Carl Bizarro at 508-644-2201 ext. 3.

Late Fees: Licenses paid after May 31st are subject to a \$5.00 late fee and then an additional \$15.00 late fee after June 30th. Finally, a \$50.00 non-criminal violation will then be issued by the Dog Officer to the owner of the dog. If the resident declines payment of the violation and dog fees, a court date is set.

Residents should notify the Office of the Town Clerk if they no longer have a dog that was previously licensed, so that office staff can update our records.

Burning Permits

Burning of brush, cane, driftwood, and forestry debris (from other than commercial and/or industrial clearing operations) is allowed with a permit between January 15 to May 1 yearly. Permits are also required for the burning of Christmas trees from December 26 to January 7. Burning of grass, hay, leaves, stumps and tires is prohibited. Permits can be obtained online at

The fee for the annual permit is \$5.00.

Resident Privilege Sticker

A resident privilege sticker is required to utilize the Transfer Station & Town Beach (Long Pond Rd, E. Freetown). Two Resident Stickers are provided to each household free of charge and are available directly at the Transfer Station. Additional stickers can be purchased for \$30 for the year. Current vehicle registration and proof of residency (tax bill, license, etc.) must be provided. Resident privilege stickers must be adhered to the vehicle and are non-transferable.

The Town of Freetown is very lucky to have a Historical Society that has such a splendid collection of the town's rich historical background. The collection mirrors life as it was "back in the day." You can stroll through the grounds and go back in time by entering some of the

original or replicated buildings. In addition to the museum, there is the old school house, the general store, the sawmill, carriage shed, the blacksmith shop, the chapel, and gazebo. The Freetown Historical Society is currently open by appointment.

Please note, the Freetown Historical Society is a separate entity from the Town of Freetown, and is not managed or operated by the Town.

Freetown Central Park

2 Memorial Drive, East Freetown

Central Park, site of Freetown's "Little Fenway", is a Townowned park that is managed by the Freetown Lakeville Athletic Association. It is home to four baseball fields for a variety of age groups, a basketball court and a walking trail. The Freetown-Fall River State Forest is a 5,000-acre forest including 25 miles of trails for hiking, horse-back riding or offriding for dirt bikes only. It's also home to a Wampanoag reservation, a splash pad (open seasonally), a pavilion and more. Free parking is available at 110 Slab Bridge Road.

Please note, the Freetown-Fall River State Forest is managed by the Massachusetts Department of Conservation & Recreation (DCR), not the Town of Freetown.



Assonet Bandstand

South Main Street, Assonet

Located in the Assonet Historic District at the Four Corners, is the Assonet Bandstand. The Bandstand is a replica of a bandstand that stood on the site of Ye Old Tavern (c. 1800), which was demolished in 1934. The 13 local residents that owned the Tavern



donated the land to the Town of Freetown for a green area. The bandstand was restored to its original 1934 image in 2021 utilizing funding provided by the State. Residents wishing to use the Bandstand must receive prior authorization from the Board of Selectmen.

Local Annual Events

Freetown has a number of local annual events – some sponsored by the Town itself, some put on by local organizations. Details of the events may vary year-to-year, but traditional information on the events is as follows:

Strawberry Festival – Put on by the Tuesday Club of Assonet. The 4th of July Parade – put on by the Town's Parade & Fireworks festival is typically held on Father's Day at the Assonet Bandstand. Committee. The Parade starts at 10am on Narrows Road in

Lakeside Festival – put on by St. John Neumann's Church, on church grounds in East Freetown. The festival is typically held Memorial Day weekend.

4th of July Fireworks & Festivities – put on by the Town's Parade & Fireworks Committee. The fireworks are typically held the 3rd of July at Hathaway Park, Water St. in Assonet. Festivities begin at 6pm, fireworks sometime after 9pm.

4th of July Parade – put on by the Town's Parade & Fireworks Committee. The Parade starts at 10am on Narrows Road in Assonet, continuing along South Main St to Hathaway Park in Assonet.

Freetown Historical Society Open House – put on by the Freetown Historical Society, 1 Slab Bridge Road in Assonet, on the first Sunday after Labor Day.

Harvest Festival – put on by St. Bernard's Church, on church grounds in Assonet. The festival is held in the fall.
