In the name of the Commonwealth you are hereby requested to notify and warn the inhabitants of the Town of Freetown who are qualified to vote in the Elections and Town Affairs to meet in the Freetown Elementary School, Auditorium, 43 Bullock Road, East Freetown, Massachusetts, on Monday, the Fifteen day of June, 2015, at 7:30 P.M., then and there to act on the following Articles, viz:

ARTICLE 1: To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate, and/or transfer such sums of money as may be necessary to defray the Town charges for the Fiscal Year 2016, viz: General Government, Town Reports, Planning Board, Finance Committee, Board of Appeals, for Protection of Persons and Property, for Health and Sanitation, for Highways, for Libraries, for Veterans' Benefits, for Cemeteries, Town Parks, Interest and Principal on School Loans, Conservation Commission, Historical Commission, and Unclassified: Tax Titles, Reserve Fund, Bristol County Retirement, Incidentals, Soil Conservation, Council on Aging, Graves' Registration Officer, Cultural Council, Capital Equipment, Capital Building Improvement, and Insurance, and/or take any action relative thereto.

Explanation: This Article serves as the introductory article for presentation of the Omnibus Budget.

ARTICLE 2: To see if the Town will vote to fix the salary and compensation of all elected officers of the Town as provided by Chapter 41, Section 108 of the General Laws, as amended, for the Fiscal Year 2016, and/or take any action relative thereto.

Elected officials are not covered under Article 10 of the Personnel Classification and Compensation Plan nor under union contract; this is the only avenue to adjust elected officials' salaries to keep pace with inflation.

ARTICLE 3: To see if the Town will vote to raise, appropriate and/or transfer from available funds the sum of Two Thousand Dollars (\$2,000.00) to pay for the purpose of supporting the Sexual Assault and Domestic Violence Program of the New Bedford Women's Center, Inc.; and/or take any action relative thereto.

Explanation: This article provides for grant funding for shelter, crisis intervention, counseling, medical and legal advocacy and educational programs to the community in relation to the issue of rape, sexual assault, and domestic violence, and/or take any action relative thereto.

ARTICLE 4: To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate and/or transfer from available funds the sum of Four Hundred Fifty-Five Dollars (\$455.00) to pay for Insect Pest Control, and/or take any action relative thereto.

ARTICLE 5: To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate and/or transfer from available funds. The sum of Nine Thousand Three Hundred Ninety-Three Dollars (\$9,393.00) to cover the cost associated with training fire department Emergency Medical Technician Intermediate (EMT-1) to meet the National Emergency Medical Scope of Practice EMT Advance requirements as adopted by the Massachusetts Department of Public Health, and/or take any action relative thereto.

Explanation: In an effort to standardize all EMS certifications, Massachusetts has adopted the National EMS Scope of Practice model and requires all Massachusetts Emergency Medical Technicians and Paramedics to meet the National Registry of Emergency Medical Technicians certification requirements by 2016 or 2017 depending on the individual EMT's recertification date. This article covers the cost to train our EMT-Intermediates to the EMT-Advance level to meet the new standard prior to the expiration of their current certifications.

ARTICLE 6: To see if the Town will vote to authorize revolving funds for certain town department, pursuant to Chapter 44, Section 53E½, of the Massachusetts General Laws, for the following programs and purposes, to determine whether such revolving fund accounts shall be credited with the following departmental receipts, to determine whether the following boards, departments or officers shall be authorized to expend amounts from such revolving fund accounts and to determine whether the maximum amounts that may be expended from such revolving fund accounts in FY2016 shall be the following amounts or any other amounts; and/or take any action relative thereto.

ARTICLE 7: To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate and/or transfer from available funds the sums of Twenty Thousand Dollars (\$20,000.00) for the purpose of maintaining, preparing, preserving and safekeeping the permanent Town of Freetown records located in the Town Clerk's Office, including any costs incidental and related thereto; and/or take an action relative thereto.

ARTICLE 8: To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate and/or transfer from available funds the sum of Forty Thousand Dollars (\$40,000.00) to fund 1/3 of the cost of the Recertification of Values Program and/or take any action relative thereto.

Explanation: This is an annual article that funds the maintenance of certain veterans' graves in the Town as provided by M. G. L. Chapter 115, Section 9.

ARTICLE 12: To see if the Town will vote to transfer the sum of Two Thousand Dollars (\$2,000.00) from the Sale of Cemetery Lots Account to be used by the Cemetery Commission for improvements to the Assonet Burying Ground, to include surveying of existing prepared land, marking out of lots, clearing new areas, performing maintenance, and improving roads and access, including any costs incidental and related thereto; and/or take any action relative thereto.

Explanation: This is an annual appropriation. According to state law, revenues from lot sales may only be spent for the benefit of the cemetery in which those lots were sold.

(1.), by deleting the strikethrough text and inserting the underlined text as follows; and further, to amend the Zoning Map to include the revised Floodplain Overlay District boundaries; and/or take any action relative thereto:

B. Floodplain District Boundaries and Base Flood Elevation and Floodway Data

1. Floodplain District Boundaries and Base Flood Elevation Data

The Floodplain District is herein established as an overlay district. The District includes all special flood hazard areas within the Town of Freetown designated as Zone A, AE, and VE on the Bristol County Flood Insurance Rate Map (FIRM) issued by the Federal Emergency Management Agency (FEMA) for the administration of the National Flood Insurance Program. The map panels of the Bristol County FIRM that are wholly or partially within the Town of Freetown are panel numbers 25005C0258F, 25005C0264F, 25005C0267F, 25005C0268F, 25005C0269F, 25005C0286F, ~~25005C0287F~~, 25005C0288F, ~~25005C0289F~~, ~~25005C0291F~~, ~~25005C0293F~~, 25005C0357F, 25005C0359F, 25005C0376F, 25005C0377F, 25005C0378F, and 25005C0381F dated July 7, 2009; ~~and~~ panel numbers 25005C0254G, 25005C0261G, 25005C0262G, 25005C0263G, and 25005C0266G dated July 16, 2014; and panel numbers 25005C0287G, 25005C0289G, 25005C0291G and 25005C0293G dated July 16, 2015. The exact boundaries of the District may be defined by the 100-year base flood elevations shown on the FIRM and further defined by the Bristol County Flood Insurance Study (FIS) report dated ~~July 16, 2014~~ July 16, 2015. The FIRM and FIS report are incorporated herein by reference and are on file with the Town Building Commissioner, Town Clerk, and Conservation Commission.

ARTICLE 19: To see if the Town will vote to amend Article 1, Section 1.2 by deleting the strike through text and inserting the underlined text, as follows:

Election of Officers-Referendum Questions

The Annual Town Meeting for the election of officers and referendum questions shall be held on the first Monday in April and for such purpose the polls shall be open from twelve o'clock noon until eight o'clock p.m. in each precinct of Town. The Town shall annually when the term of office of any incumbent expires and except when other provisions are made by law, choose by ballot from the registered voters the following Town Officers: A *Moderator*; One *Selectman*, who shall also serve as a member of the *Board of Health* and a member of the *Personnel Board*; One *Assessor*; a *Highway Surveyor*; Two *Library Trustees*; One *Cemetery Commissioner*; a *Tree Warden*; One *Water and Sewer Commissioner*; One *Planning Board* member; and a *Town Clerk*. The term of office for each such office shall be 3 years except for the Planning Board members whose term of office shall be 5 years.

The Town shall elect two *Finance Committee* members in 1992, two Finance Committee members in 1993 and three Finance Committee members in 1994, all for three year terms, with successive elections every three years thereafter. ~~In 2004 the Town shall increase the size of the School Committee from three to five members by electing two additional members, one for a three year term and one for a two year term, and thereafter all five School Committee members shall be elected for three year terms.~~

Commencing with the 2012 Annual Town Election, four members shall be elected to the *Housing Authority*. The initial terms of such members shall be for five, four, two, and one years, with the candidate receiving the highest number of votes to serve the five-year term, the candidate with the next highest number of votes to serve for the four-year term, and so on. Upon expiration of the initial terms of office, all member shall be elected for terms of five years.

In accordance with the provisions of Chapter 5 of the Acts of 2012, eight members of the Freetown Lakeville Regional School Committee shall be elected, four of whom shall be registered voters of the Town of Freetown and four of whom shall be registered voters of the Town of Lakeville. Commencing with the 2012 Annual Town Election, four members from both towns shall be elected for initial terms as follows: two for three-year terms; one for a two-year term; and one for a one-year term. Upon expiration of the initial terms of office, all members shall be elected for terms of three years.


