

MEDICARE

It's that time of year again! If you are enrolled in a Medicare Prescription Drug Plan or a Medicare Advantage Plan (HMO/ PPO), expect an information packet from your plan by the end of September. It is important to understand and save this information: it explains the changes in your plan for 2023. Premiums, deductibles, co-pays, and the drugs covered by your plan can change significantly! During Medicare Open Enrollment, you can adjust your plan for next year. SHINE Counselors help you understand your plan changes as well as other options you may have. Call in early September to discuss your insurance questions, or schedule your SHINE phone or face-to-face appointment, during the Open Enrollment from October 15 through December 7th!

REMINDER: Bring your card and drug list to your appointment! To make an appointment with a SHINE counselor, call your local senior center in early September and ask for a SHINE appointment. Remember that appointments fill fast during Open Enrollment. You can reach a SHINE counselor by telephone. Call 774-203-1910. Once you get the SHINE answering machine, leave your name, number, and town in which you live. A volunteer will call you back as soon as possible.

Medicare Prescription Plan

Each year thousands of Medicare beneficiaries reach a gap in their Medicare prescription drug plan that is often referred to as the "donut hole". If you reach that gap, you will see your prescription drug costs increase dramatically! Don't let this happen to you. **Prescription Advantage** can help. Prescription advantage is a state-sponsored program that supplements your Medicare drug plan to fill the gap. **For more information about Prescription Advantage, call MassOptions at 1-800-243-4636,** Monday through Friday, 9:00 AM to 5:00 PM. We also accept donations of above equipment.

<u>"Brown Bag" Program</u> Wednesday, August 24th From 9:00 AM to 10:00 AM <u>AT THE FRONT OF THE BUILDING</u>

Starting in July, you come into the building, sign in, then receive your bag.

"<u>Brown Bag</u>" distribution will be held at the Freetown Council on Aging. You must be 60 years of age or older. Recipients must be low income, as measured by participation in (or eligibility for) at least one other

program in which proof of income has been demonstrated. This includes elders who are eligible for SSI, Medicaid, Fuel Assistance and Food Stamps, OR your gross household income is at or below the guidelines listed.

1 person	\$1,872 per month
2 people	\$2,538 per month
3 people	\$3,204 per month
4 people	\$3,870 per month

We will deliver the brown bag if you cannot pick it up. If not picked up by Thursday, we will donate it.

VAN SCHEDULING: Please be sure to wear a mask, for your safety and ours. Thank you!

We can only have one person, unless in same household, in our vehicle at a time. If you have an appointment, we must make sure it does not interfere with another one. The van runs every **Monday**, **Tuesday**, **Wednesday and Thursday**. Please call the COA at 508-763-9557 for further information. We must have at least a 48-hour notice for the van. <u>Wheelchair/Transport Chairs will</u> <u>need to have an escort. We will need the name of your</u> <u>escort when you book the van.</u>

In order to be more efficient with the van when you call in, please have the exact <u>name</u>, <u>address and phone</u> <u>number of your destination</u>, <u>and if you need the</u> <u>wheelchair lift</u>. We can no longer schedule without this information. Thank you in advance for your cooperation.

RURAL DEVELOPMENT

Home Improvement & Repair Loans and Grants (Section 504) are funded directly by the Government. These loans and grants are available to assist people who live in rural communities with a population of 20,000 or less.

Purpose: The Very Low-Income Housing Repair program provides loans and grants to very low-income homeowners to repair, improve, or modernize their dwellings or to remove health and safety hazards.

→<u>504 GRANTS</u>

- Applicant must live in an eligible town
- Applicant must be 62 years of age or older
- Applicant must own and occupy a modest dwelling

• Applicant must have a very low income and be unable to repay a loan at 1% annual interest rate

• The repairs and improvements to be made must be necessary to make the dwelling safe and sanitary and/or remove health and safety hazards.

 \rightarrow A 504 Grant can be approved for up to \$7,500. The applicant does not have to pay the grant back to the government, but will be required to remain in the dwelling for a period of three years after receiving the grant. Income limits for the Grants are:

1 \$17,650 2 \$20,200 3 \$22,700 4 \$25,250

 \rightarrow The total assistance available through the Section 504 Program is \$27,500, which could consist of a combination loan and grant.

→<u>504 LOANS</u>

- Applicant must live in an eligible town
- Applicant must be at least 18 years of age
- Applicant must own and occupy a dwelling
- Applicant must have a very low income and be able to repay a loan at 1% annual interest rate

• The repairs and improvements may be general repairs to improve or modernize the property, as long as the dwelling remains modest.

\rightarrow A 504 Loan can be approved for \$20,000 at a 1% interest rate which is payable over 20 years.

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FARMERS' MARKET COUPONS FOR ELDERS

Unfortunately, Farmers Market Coupon Distribution has been delayed. We are anticipating receiving the coupons by early August. Please contact your local Council on Aging to see if they have received the coupons.

Farmers' market coupons are available for low income elders age 60 or older who have an annual household income of \$25,142 (single) or \$33,874 (married). Disabled individuals under the age of 60 who live in elderly housing and receive Bristol Elder Services' Nutrition Program benefits are also eligible. The \$25 in coupons may be used to purchase fresh fruits and vegetables at any local farmers' market. A limited number of coupons are available and will be distributed on a first come, first served basis. Elders must obtain coupons in person at one of the distribution sites or if they are unable to do so in person, a completed Proxy Form must be presented at the distribution site.
