

We will need the</u> <u>name of your escort when you book the van.</u> In order to be more efficient with the van when you call in, please have the exact <u>name</u>, address and <u>phone number of your destination</u>, and if you need <u>the wheelchair lift</u>. We can no longer schedule without this information. Thank you in advance for your cooperation.

LOAN CLOSET

We have a medical shed-loan closet if you need any equipment. We just ask that you return them for the next person when you no longer need them. Canes, crutches, wheel chairs, commodes, walkers, shower chairs and benches, etc. We also have adult incontinence products if you need them. Please call us for availability. We also accept donations of above equipment.

Annie Maxim House, Inc. Housing Assistance Program

Does your home have a need for repairs that you cannot afford to fix? The Annie Maxim House Housing Assistance Program may be able to help!! The program provides funding for <u>small home repairs</u> in order to enhance the health, safety and quality of life <u>for elders who are 62 years of age or older</u>. Please note the program is designed to *enhance the safety of your life* and ensure your needs are being met. Projects are restricted budget wise to accommodate *small versus large* repairs. Examples of past projects funded include:

- \checkmark Repair of wooden steps to ensure safety
- ✓ Installing hand rails to minimize fall risk
- ✓ Funding of stair chair lift to access second floor bedroom.
- ✓ Repair of broken window for safety/improve heating

Brown Bag" Program Wednesday, July 27th From 9:00 AM to 10:00 AM <u>AT THE FRONT OF THE BUILDING</u> Starting in July, you come into the building, sign in, then receive your bag.

"Brown Bag" distribution will be held at the Freetown Council on Aging. You must be 60 years of age or older. Recipients must be low income, as measured by participation in (or eligibility for) at least one other program in which proof of income has been demonstrated. This includes elders who are eligible for SSI, Medicaid, Fuel Assistance and Food Stamps, OR your gross household income is at or below the guidelines listed.

- 1 person \$1,872 per month
- 2 people \$2,538 per month
- 3 people \$3,204 per month
- 4 people \$3,870 per month

We will deliver the brown bag if you cannot pick it up. If not picked up by Thursday, we will donate it.

RURAL DEVELOPMENT

Home Improvement & Repair Loans and Grants (Section 504) are funded directly by the Government. These loans and grants are available to assist people who live in rural communities with a population of 20,000 or less.

Purpose: The Very Low-Income Housing Repair program provides loans and grants to very low-income homeowners to repair, improve, or modernize their dwellings or to remove health and safety hazards.

→<u>504 GRANTS</u>

• Applicant must live in an eligible town

- Applicant must be 62 years of age or older
- Applicant must own and occupy a modest dwelling
- Applicant must have a very low income and be unable to repay a loan at 1% annual interest rate

• The repairs and improvements to be made must be necessary to make the dwelling safe and sanitary and/or remove health and safety hazards.

 \rightarrow A 504 Grant can be approved for up to \$7,500. The applicant does not have to pay the grant back to the government, but will be required to remain in the dwelling for a period of three years after receiving the grant. Income limits for the Grants are:

1 \$17,650 2 \$20,200 3 \$22,700 4 \$25,250

 \rightarrow The total assistance available through the Section 504 Program is \$27,500, which could consist of a combination loan and grant.

→<u>504 LOANS</u>

- Applicant must live in an eligible town
- Applicant must be at least 18 years of age
- Applicant must own and occupy a dwelling
- Applicant must have a very low income and be able to repay a loan at 1% annual interest rate
- The repairs and improvements may be general

repairs to improve or modernize the property, as long as the dwelling remains modest.

 \rightarrow A 504 Loan can be approved for \$20,000 at a 1% interest rate which is payable over 20 years.

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A New Way to Sign up for Medicare Part B

As you know, as of March 17, 2020 all local Social Security offices were closed to the public for in-person service due to the COVID 19 pandemic. <u>Their offices</u> <u>are now open by appointment.</u> Social Security understands that due to current circumstances, beneficiaries may have difficulties submitting their Medicare enrollment forms.

To assist beneficiaries who have stopped working and are seeking immediate enrollment into Medicare Part B, Social Security has developed a method for beneficiaries to fax their enrollment forms. Now Medicare beneficiaries can fax Medicare Part B form, CMS-40B

(https://www.cms.gov/Medicare/CMS-Forms/CMS-Forms/CMS-items/CMS009718) along with proof of employment, Group Health Plan (GHP), or Large Group Health Plan (LGHP) to 1-833-914-2016, if unable to mail the forms directly to your local Social Security office, To find your local office mailing address, please use our Social Security Office Locater (https://secure.ssa.gov/ICON/main.jsp) Please visit the Social Security & Coronavirus information page
