This includes elders who are eligible for SSI, Medicaid, Fuel Assistance and Food Stamps, OR your gross household income is at or below the guidelines listed.

# USDA CAN HELP REPAIR YOUR HOME RURAL DEVELOPMENT

Home Improvement & Repair Loans and Grants (Section 504) are funded directly by the Government. These loans and grants are available to assist people who live in rural communities with a population of 20,000 or less.

**Purpose:** The Very Low-Income Housing Repair program provides loans and grants to very low-income homeowners to repair, improve, or modernize their dwellings or to remove health and safety hazards.

#### →<u>504 GRANTS</u>

- Applicant must live in an eligible town
- Applicant must be 62 years of age or older
- Applicant must own and occupy a modest dwelling

• Applicant must have a very low income and be unable to repay a loan at 1% annual interest rate

• The repairs and improvements to be made must be necessary to make the dwelling safe and sanitary and/or remove health and safety hazards.

 $\rightarrow$ A 504 Grant can be approved for up to \$7,500. The applicant does not have to pay the grant back to the government, but will be required to remain in the dwelling for a period of three years after receiving the grant.

 $\rightarrow$ The total assistance available through the Section 504 Program is \$27,500, which could consist of a combination loan and grant.

#### →<u>504 LOANS</u>

- Applicant must live in an eligible town
- Applicant must be at least 18 years of age
- Applicant must own and occupy a dwelling
- Applicant must have a very low income and be able to repay a loan at 1% annual interest rate

• The repairs and improvements may be general repairs to improve or modernize the property, as long as the dwelling remains modest.

 $\rightarrow$  A 504 Loan can be approved for \$20,000 at a 1% interest rate which is payable over 20 years. Income limits yearly by household for Freetown:
