SHINE

It is that time of the year again - Open Enrollment! Beginning on October 15 through December 7, all Medicare enrollees are strongly urged to review their Medicare coverage with a SHINE counselor. Whether you are enrolled in traditional Medicare or Medicare Advantage, you should make an appointment to review your coverage to ensure that you are enrolled in a plan that works best for your current medical situation. Insurance plans make changes each year – especially to part D coverage for prescriptions. If your prescriptions have changed, it is strongly suggested that you review your coverage for the upcoming year. I will have office hours at the Senior Center during Open Enrollment. Please call the COA to schedule an appointment – all appointments must be scheduled. I am still requesting that the SHINE questionnaire be filled out prior to the scheduled appointment. This form assists me in preparing ahead of time so that meeting times can be held to a minimum. Thank you - I look forward to seeing everyone in person again!

Does your home have a need for repairs that you cannot afford to fix? The Annie Maxim House Housing Assistance Program may be able to help!! The program provides funding for <u>small home</u> repairs in order to enhance the health, safety and quality of life for elders who are 62 years of age or older.

Please note the program is designed to *enhance the safety of your life* and ensure your needs are being met. Projects are restricted budget wise to accommodate *small versus large* repairs. Examples of past projects funded include:

- ✓ Repair of wooded steps to ensure safety
- ✓ Installing hand rails to minimize fall risk
- ✓ Funding of stair chair lift to access second floor bedroom.

"**Brown Bag**" distribution will be held at the Freetown Council on Aging. You must be 60 years of age or older. Recipients must be low income, as measured by participation in (or eligibility for) at least one other program in which proof of income has been demonstrated. This includes elders who are eligible for SSI, Medicaid, Fuel Assistance and Food Stamps, OR your gross household income is at or below the guidelines listed.

1 person	\$1,872 per month
2 people	\$2,538 per month
3 people	\$3,204 per month
4 people	\$3,870 per month
