Does your home have a need for repairs that you cannot afford to fix? The Annie Maxim House Housing Assistance Program may be able to help!! The program provides funding for <u>small home repairs</u> in order to enhance the health, safety and quality of life <u>for elders</u> who are 62 years of age or older.

Please note the program is designed to *enhance the safety* of your life and ensure your needs are being met. Projects are restricted budget wise to accommodate *small versus* large repairs. Examples of past projects funded include:

- ✓ Repair of wooded steps to ensure safety
- ✓ Installing hand rails to minimize fall risk
- ✓ Funding of stair chair lift to access second floor bedroom.
- ✓ Repair of broken window for safety/improve heating

"Brown Bag" distribution will be held at the Freetown Council on Aging. You must be 60 years of age or older. Recipients must be low income, as measured by participation in (or eligibility for) at least one other program in which proof of income has been demonstrated. This includes elders who are eligible for SSI, Medicaid, Fuel Assistance and Food Stamps, OR your gross household income is at or below the guidelines listed.
