It was agreed that the FHC needs to remind the Freetown Highway Department that in regard to work being done on the South Main Street Bridge, the bridge is on the National Register and the FHC should be notified of the work.

- 2) Historic New England. Mary asked that we check on upcoming events that we may want to attend.

- 4) Assonet's Hathaway Library – The town building is on the National Register. The FHC is concerned about the planned window replacement. Travis will speak with Lucille Rosa, of the library trustees and ask what the status is of the windows.
- 5) The FHC thought it would be nice to have an FHC table at the Strawberry Festival on June 19th. Nicole volunteered to man the table.
