This includes elders who are eligible for SSI, Medicaid, Fuel Assistance and Food Stamps, OR your gross household income is at or below the guidelines listed.

USDA CAN HELP REPAIR YOUR HOME RURAL DEVELOPMENT

Home Improvement & Repair Loans and Grants (Section 504) are funded directly by the Government. These loans and grants are available to assist people who live in rural communities with a population of 20,000 or less.

Purpose: The Very Low-Income Housing Repair program provides loans and grants to very low-income homeowners to repair, improve, or modernize their dwellings or to remove health and safety hazards.

→<u>504 GRANTS</u>

• Applicant must live in an eligible town

- Applicant must be 62 years of age or older
- Applicant must own and occupy a modest dwelling
- Applicant must have a very low income and be unable to repay a loan at 1% annual interest rate

• The repairs and improvements to be made must be necessary to make the dwelling safe and sanitary and/or remove health and safety hazards.

 \rightarrow A 504 Grant can be approved for up to \$7,500. The applicant does not have to pay the grant back to the government, but will be required to remain in the dwelling for a period of three years after receiving the grant.

 \rightarrow The total assistance available through the Section 504 Program is \$27,500, which could consist of a combination loan and grant.

→<u>504 LOANS</u>

- Applicant must live in an eligible town
- Applicant must be at least 18 years of age
- Applicant must own and occupy a dwelling
- Applicant must have a very low income and be able to repay a loan at 1% annual interest rate

• The repairs and improvements may be general repairs to improve or modernize the property, as long as the dwelling remains modest.

 \rightarrow A 504 Loan can be approved for \$20,000 at a 1% interest rate which is payable over 20 years. Income limits yearly by household for Freetown:
